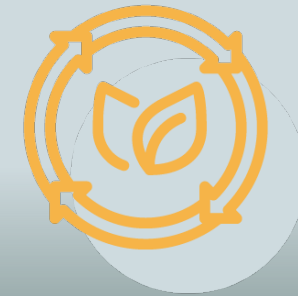

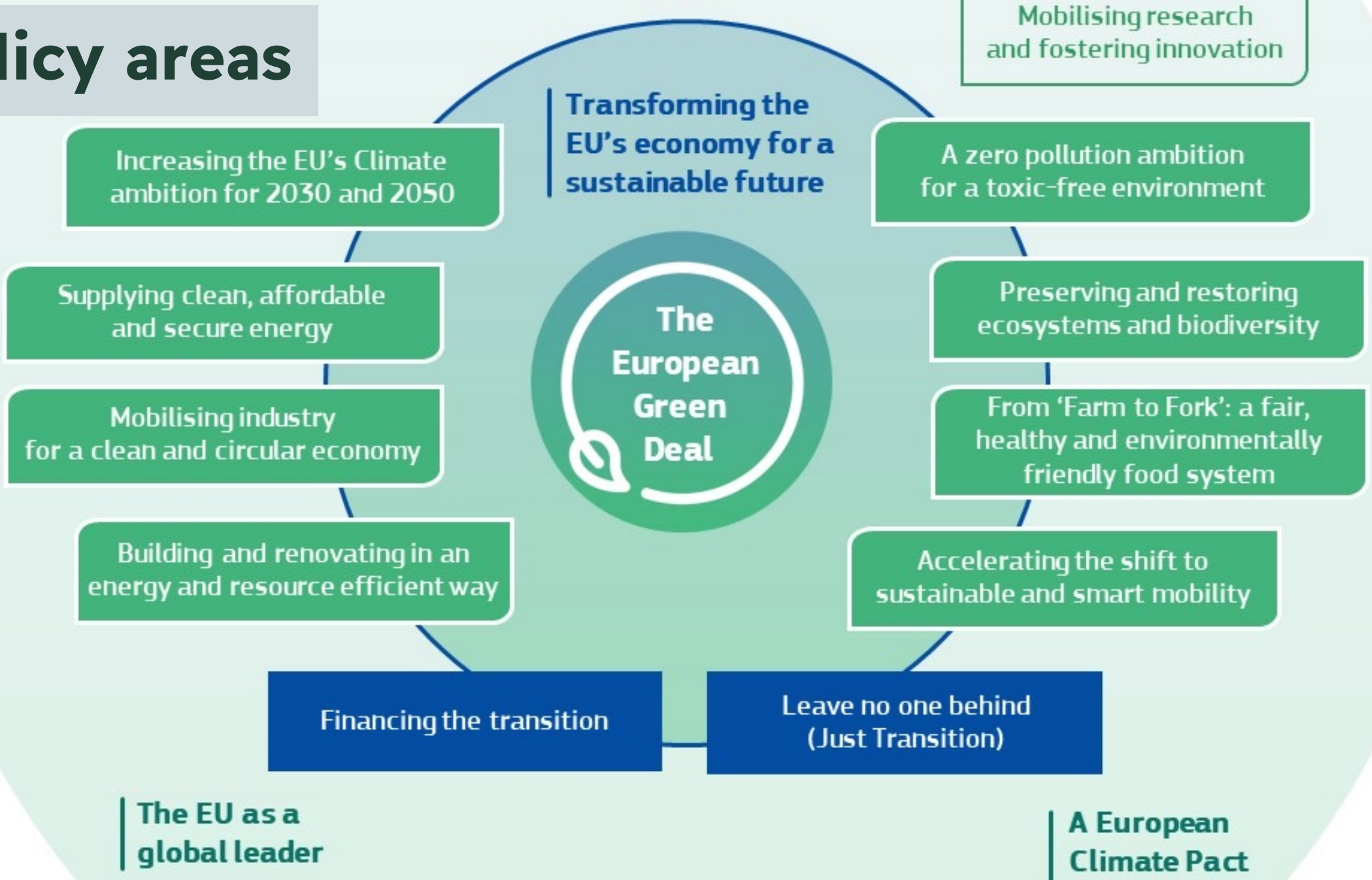

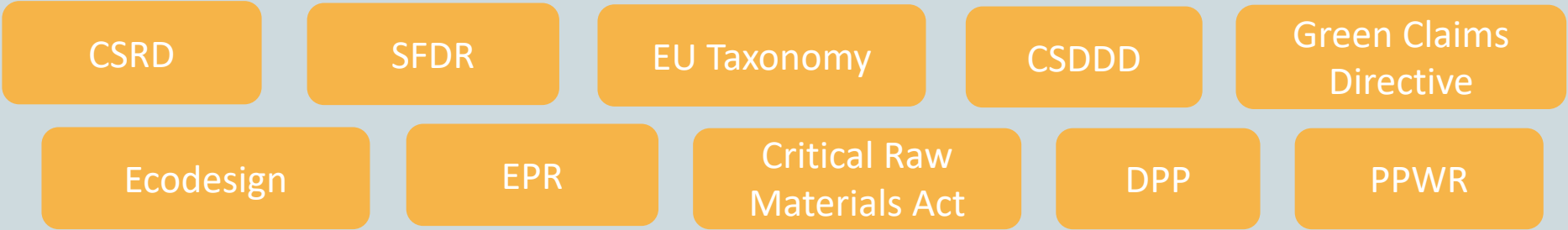

CSRD – Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive

ESG reporting obligation.
ESG = Environment, Social, and Governance

Green Claims Directive

Lays down detailed rules on the substantiation, communication and verification of voluntary environmental claims and environmental labels used by traders that market products to EU consumers.

SFDR – Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation

Clarity on fund-sustainability.

Extended Producer Responsibility

Longer producer responsibility.

EU Taxonomy

Provide companies, investors and policymakers with appropriate definitions for which economic activities can be considered environmentally sustainable.

Critical Raw Materials Act

Access to safe & sustainable supply of critical materials.

CSDDD – Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive

Proces to identify, evaluate and manage sustainability (ESG) risks (closely related to CSRD).

Digital Product Passport

Obligation to have a digital product passport understandable by average consumer.

European Ecodesign Directive

Making products more sustainable, reusable, repairable, upgradeable, recyclable and less harmful.

PPWR (Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation)

Measures to prevent the production of packaging waste, and to promote reuse of packaging and recycling and other forms of recovering packaging waste.
