




PEOPLE NEED 2 THINGS

I. INFORMATION



• 2. SENSE THAT SOMEONE IS IN CONTROL

SCENARIO

There is an explosion in the commons area at the local high school. Severe injuries and possible loss of life have been reported.

• What will need to be done to manage this situation?

POSSIBILITIES...

- Attend to injured
- Evacuate others
- Partner with responders on scene



- Communicate, Communicate, Communicate!
- Reunite families
- Recovery activities

 Policies and procedures for 3 types of events:


- Get 'em out

SCENARIO CONTINUES...

- Students are relocated to a pre-assigned Evacuation Site
 - How Do We Notify Parents to Pick Up Their Children?
 - How do we guarantee that students get to the Alternative Site?
 - How do we guarantee that only the appropriate person take the child?
 - How do we document what actions we've taken?
 - What do you do with Convergent Volunteers?




IN AN EMERGENCY...

PARENTS NEED 2 THINGS

I. INFORMATION

• 2. SENSE THAT SOMEONE IS IN CONTROL




3. FAMILY REUNIFICATION

AREA



- Adult Checks in at Check In Gate
- Team checks emergency form and ID
- Staff completes the top copy of Student Release Form
- Request is made to Student Supervision area



- Staff fills out section that documents student status and time student leaves
- Student is escorted to Reunification Center
- Adult ID is checked again
- Adult fills out portion with time, destination and signature
- Copy is filed in alphabetical order



• What can we do before an emergency to reduce the chaos and the stress to individuals and the school system?

BEFORE AN EMERGENCY

- Teach parents and students the policies and procedures for releasing students
- Help parents understand what to expect on the day of the emergency
- Practice drills
- Pre print policies and procedures to give to parents at Release Gate

SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

- How would you describe your school/district? Rural? Urban? Small? Medium? Large?
- How do your students get to and from school?
- Where are the parents of your students during the day?
- What challenges do you face?
- What is unique about your school community?
- What resources do you have to assist in an emergency at your school?

TO DO LIST...

- Forms and info in portable box
- Designate Family Reunification Team
- Identify locations of Reunification System
- Obtain supplies
- Train staff



DURING THE EMERGENCY

• Follow the plan

• Reunification Team begin releasing students and reuniting families according to plan




• Be flexible


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HOW TO TALK TO FAMILIES

- Stay Calm
- Provide Facts --- Frequently
- DON'T speculate
- Keep in small groups if possible
- Ask for visible Law Enforcement presence
- Give them copies of policies and procedures



SENSE THAT SOMEONE IS IN CONTROL

- Have Family Reunification System set up
- Have appropriate equipment
- Have appropriate records available
- Have adequate staff
- Have preprinted copies of policies and procedures for parents
- Provide security



SCENARIO # 2

- I 50 of your students go on an overnight trip to a Science Camp. 22 students get sick the first day, by the morning of the second day, 87 more students are sick and 5 of the 7 staff members are also sick.
