These aren't close friends, but you have met them.

People you interact with at: Conferences, Volunteer opportunities Internships, Career Fairs

ZONE 3

CREATIVE CONNECTIONS

People you have a link to, and it's worth trying to create a connection

- Alumni from your school
- Speakers at a conference
- Guests on a podcast you listen to
- Someone in a job you'd like to have someday

What do I say to these people?

Rule #1: Flattery works:

"I heard you speak at the National Sports Forum and was blown away by the valuable content you shared. I'd really appreciate the chance to connect with you!"

Rule #2: Asking for advice works:

"Hi _____, I'm currently studying sports management at your alma mater, the University of Awesome! I too would like to pursue a role in [insert their role] and was wondering if I could ask you some questions about your career journey?"

Rule #3: Follow up questions work:

"Hi Mailynh, I just listened to your podcast interview on the Work in Sports podcast and took furious notes! The advice was incredible! I had one follow up question on phone interview techniques, could we connect?"
