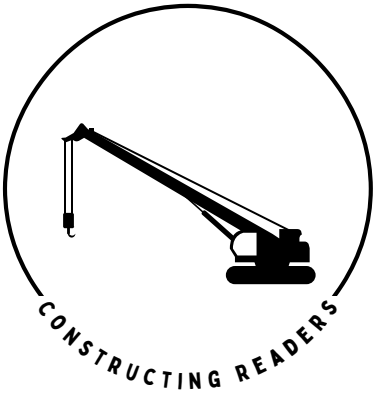

- I can read and spell letter sounds.
- I can recognize capital and lowercase letters.
- I can write capital and lowercase letters.
- I can grow my vocabulary.





# CLASS OVERVIEW

## GROWTH MINDSET

Growth mindset is a key element in learning how to do any task.

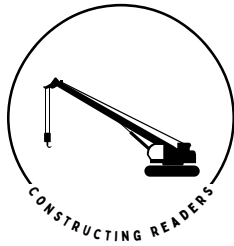
It is the belief that persistence and grit can help you achieve anything.

We want to help instill a growth mindset in your child. We'll spend a few minutes at the beginning of each lesson going over an aspect of growth mindset.

This could include:

- Learning about how their reading brains work
- Practicing positive phrases to get pumped up for learning
- Discussing how to track their learn and see their growth
- Other activities to help them grow grit and believe in themselves!





# CLASS OVERVIEW

## PHONOLOGICAL AWARENESS

Phonological awareness is the ability to recognize the sound structure of our words.

This is an essential skill in becoming a reader.

Some of the phonemic awareness skills your child will work on include rhyming, syllables, onset-rime and hearing individual sounds in words.

We're hoping you see how easy it can be to practice these skills and can continue the learning throughout the day! This is a great skill to incorporate anywhere and anytime!





# CLASS OVERVIEW

## REVIEWING SKILLS

We spend time in every lesson reviewing letter names and sounds, writing sounds, and reading words.

It is so important that these early skills are brought to mastery, meaning your child can do these tasks effortlessly. This way more focus can go towards comprehension of the text instead of using all their energy on decoding.

During our reading words review, we will be reading both real and nonsense words. The purpose of this is to ensure your child truly understands phonics skills and is not just memorizing words.





# CLASS OVERVIEW

## NEW CONCEPTS

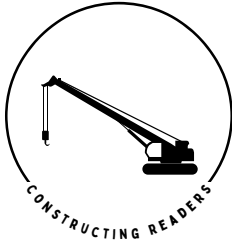
The new concept portion of our lesson is to give a deeper look into letters.

We spend time examining what our mouths are doing for that sounds which helps make the learning multisensory and will help it stick.

They will also think of words that have that sound and practice writing the capital and lowercase letters.

These concepts will also be the center of our writing and reading portion of the lesson so they can practice it multiple ways.





# CLASS OVERVIEW

## WRITING LETTERS

They will be practicing writing words using our new concept. Your child will need something to write with and write on for this part of the lesson. You also can pause the video if they need time to write their letters.

Our format is very repetitive so that they can build strong habits in decoding words. Research shows that reading and writing go hand in hand so the more your child can write the letter the better they will be at reading it!

When you enroll in this class you will have access to printable sheets to download and use with this part of the lesson if you wish. If you have plastic sleeves and whiteboard markers you can use the sheets over and over!

## READING A STORY

Your child will be reading a story alongside their teacher to help instill the new concept even further.

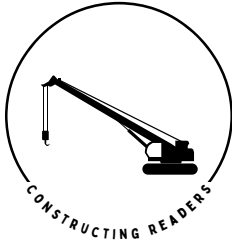
The goal of this class is to solidify letters so we will only be asking your child to read words that have skills we have worked on with them. Any other word I will read and they can follow along. We can only hold children accountable for what they have been directly taught!

The story will also be in the extension activities! You can continue to practice this story together over and over again!

It is important that if your child reads something incorrectly that you pause them, have them tap each sound of the word and then read it again. You want them practicing words correctly every time!

## **LISTENING TO A STORY AND**

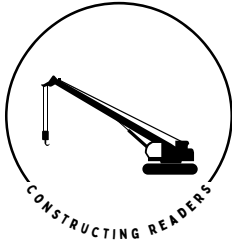
### **LEARNING NEW WORDS!**

This portion of the lesson will explicitly teach a vocabulary word and then apply it to a short story!

Growing your child's vocabulary is an incredibly important step in helping them become a skilled reader! The more words your child knows out loud, the easier it will be to read them on paper!

As the grown up, make sure to take note of how the new word is explained and feel free to use a similar approach with other words that you are teaching your child!
