

## Lesson Six – Cruising Peacefully Matthew 8:18-27, Matthew 14:22-36

Sometimes we feel things are going great in our lives. Everything is working out the way it should, things are calm, peace is in our lives. And then BOOM, things change suddenly. The peace becomes strife. The calm becomes stormy. And we cry out for help. The same thing happened to Jesus' disciples, not once, but twice during Jesus' time on earth. - 2. Think about the most recent "storm" in your life? How did you respond? What has happened with your faith since that storm? How can you apply the lessons learned today to the storms in your life?
- 3. Memorize Matthew 14:27b.
