How I got started

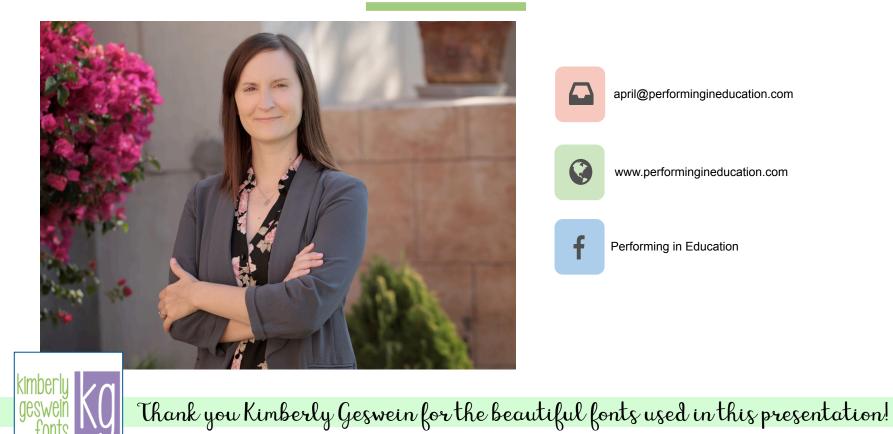
