PAINTING MOOD & MOONLIGHT

Course supplies

Paint colors

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- I'm painting with oils, but you can use acrylics if you prefer.
- Use whichever brand of paints you like best. (I prefer professional-grade brands.)

Ultramarine Blue (cool)	Cassel Earth*
Phthalo Blue (warm)	Titanium White
Cadmium Yellow Light	
Cadmium Red Light	

*I use the LUKAS 1862 brand of Cassel Earth, which has a unique, purplish cast. If you can't find this brand, you can mix something similar; for instance – mixing Van Dyke Brown with a bit of Alizarin Crimson and white. (If you're mixing your own, be sure to watch the bonus video on mixing this color included in the Supplies & Resources section of the course.)

Brushes

We'll use a variety of brushes to paint this nocturne. These are the brush shapes I typically use for almost every landscape painting.

- The brush sizes listed are based on the 16"x20" course painting. If you work larger or smaller, please adjust your brush sizes accordingly.
- The measurements listed (inches and millimeters) are the approximate width of the brush. If you have something close, you do not need to buy new brushes.
- Be aware that the *size* number will vary from brand to brand and from series to series (within the same brand!).
- I'm using the Princeton Brush series listed below. Use whichever brush brand you prefer.

#12 Catalyst Flat (1" or 25 mm)	#2 Siberia Kolinsky Round (.07" or 1.9 mm)
#3 Catalyst Angle Bright (1/4" or 6.4 mm)	#4 Siberia Kolinsky Round (.09" or 2.4 mm)
#6 Catalyst Angle Bright (1/2" or 25.36 mm)	Velvetouch Oval Mop (3/4" or 17.3 mm)
#2 Catalyst Filbert (1/4" or 6 mm)	#2 Select Artiste Script Liner (.1" or 2.54 mm)
#2 Imperial Short Filbert (1/8" or 2.95 mm)	

We'll also make and use some custom texture brushes.

Inexpensive or old round brushes in a variety of sizes

Primed canvas or panel (16"x20" or the same proportion)
Conte pencil or other drawing tool
Ruler or straight edge
Spray workable fixative (for your pencil drawing)
Odorless Mineral Spirits or turpentine substitute (for oil painters)
Note: I'm using Chelsea's Lavender Brush Cleaner after the imprimatura stage
Container for mineral spirits (oil painters) – or for water (acrylic painters)
Rubber or nitrile gloves
Paper towels
Palette
Liquin Original (Winsor & Newton) or other alkyd medium (for oil painters)
Scissors and / or X-Acto style knife (for making custom brushes)
Mahl stick (Keeps your hand steady and off the paint; very useful, but not required.)
