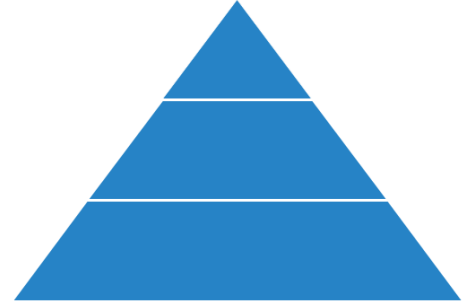


FRAMEWORKS

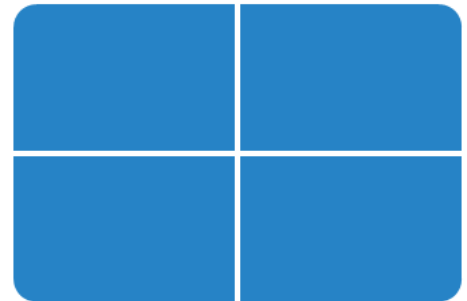
TRIANGLE

Related items of increasing value or successive steps



RECTANGLE

A set of items of equal importance that create a whole



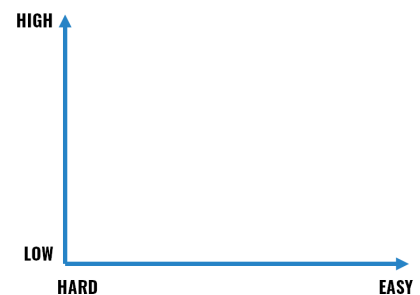
SET OF THREE

Three ideas which combined to offer high level idea or story



Two Axes

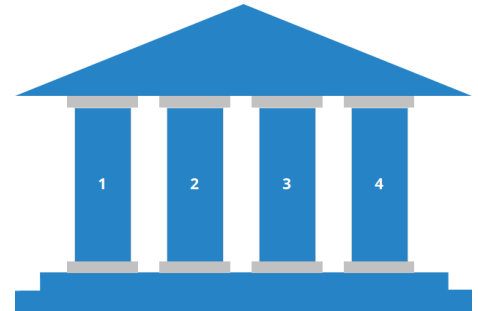
Two variables assessment resulting in clear rank of value



FRAMEWORKS

HOUSE

Foundation + core factors + roof
holding everything together



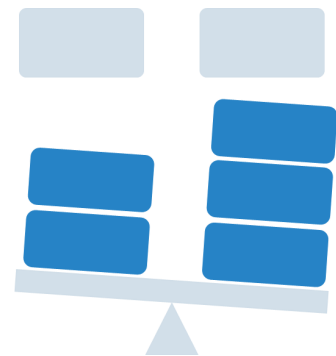
PROCESS

A series of success steps or a
timeline of events



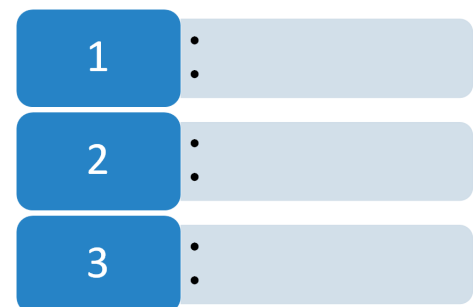
SCALE

Showing the relative comparison
of factors in a decision



LISTS

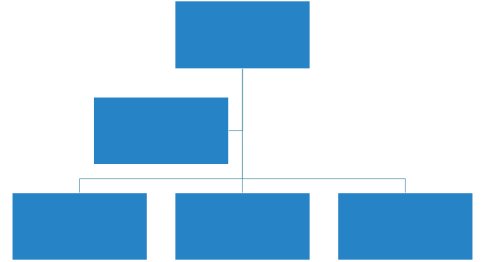
Lists of a number of factors,
criteria, or descriptors



FRAMEWORKS

HIERARCHY

Shows relative rank of variables, issues, or people



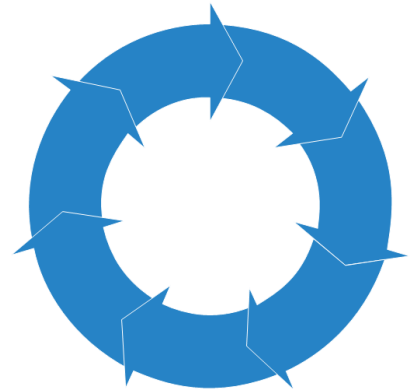
WHEEL

A large set of variables or factors that fit together



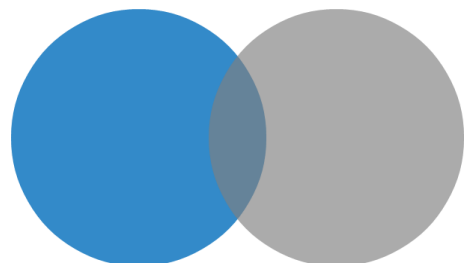
WHEEL CYCLE

A continuous cycle of events that loop over and over



VENN DIAGRAM

Identifying the overlap between two things



EXAMPLES

PEPSI - CORPORATE STRATEGY

A variation on the "house" framework. Three pillars + underlying values held together by mission + vision

BCG - TRANSFORMATION

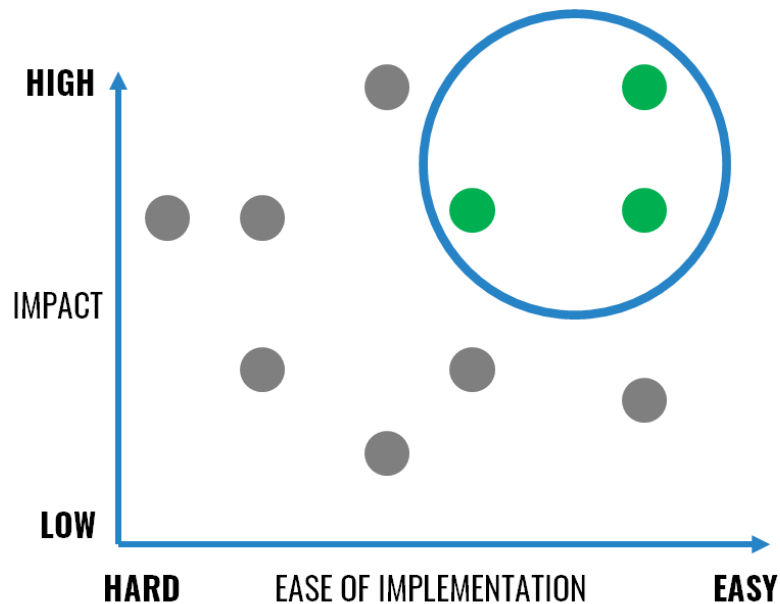
A variation on the rectangle. Top two elements of equal importance. "Organizing for sustained performance" happens throughout. All held together by "value creation"



EXAMPLES

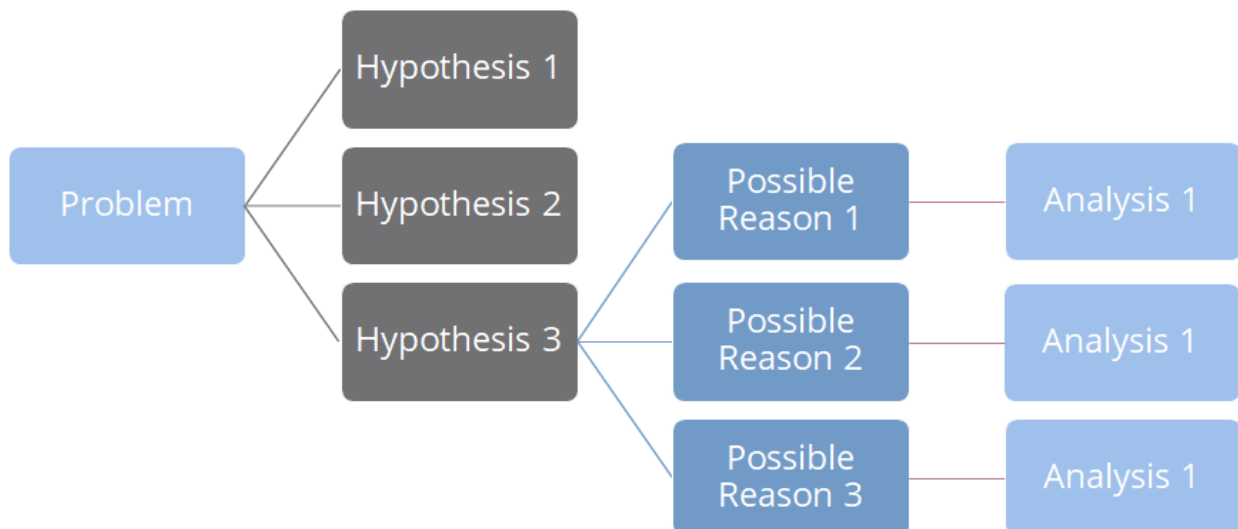
EASE OF IMPLEMENTATION VS. IMPACT

A two axes ranking exercise often used to team workshops to align around relative ease and potential impact



ISSUE TREE

A hierarchy of issues starting with a high-level problem, often used in consulting to identify areas of focus for a project



EXAMPLES

MCKINSEY 7S FRAMEWORK

A remix on the wheel framework with a central circle tying everything together. An older, but famous, framework.
