To check the status of a pending trademark application in the USPTO, go to www.tsdr.uspto.gov and enter serial number of application.

Then Click on “Documents” tab.

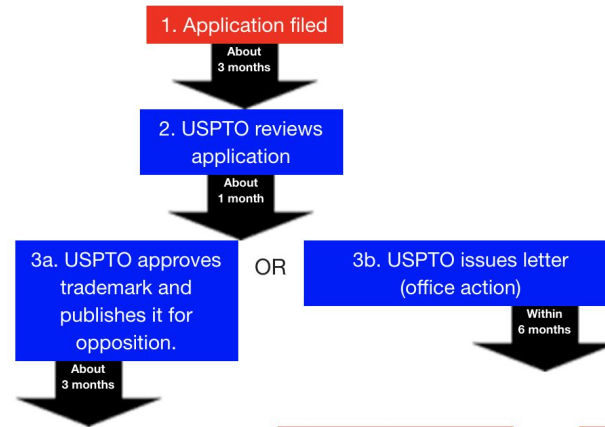
