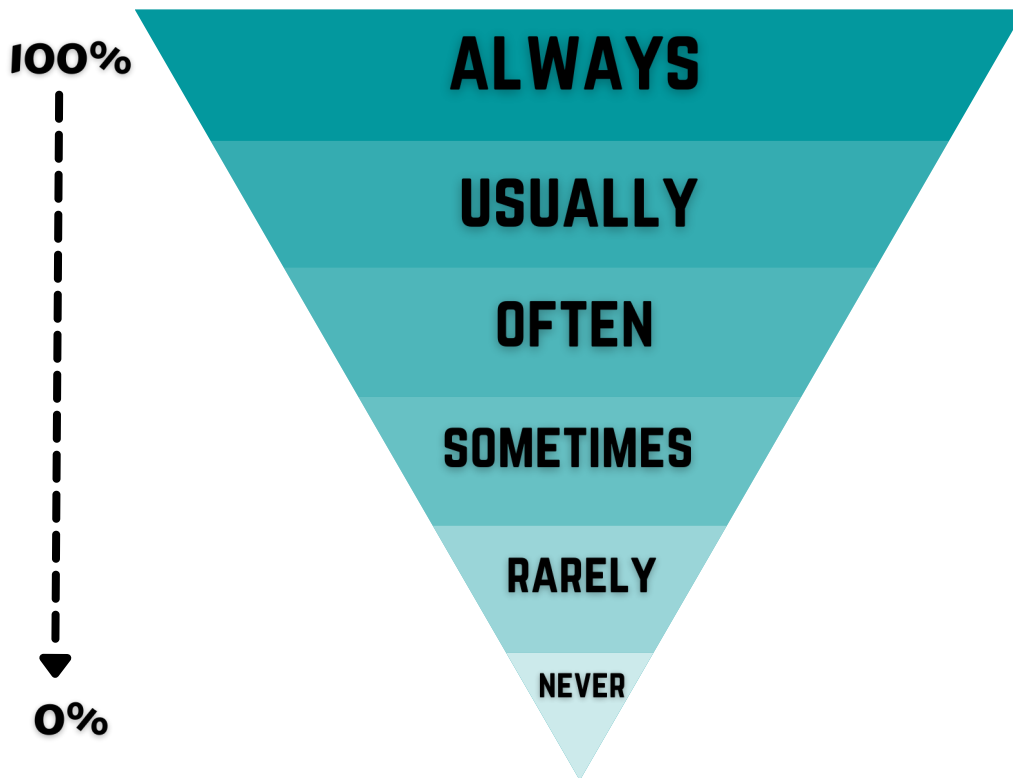


FREQUENCY ADVERBS

Position of frequency adverbs:

Affirmative	Vicky usually <u>drives</u> to work. before the main verb
	Vicky <u>is</u> never late for work. after the verb to be
Negative	Vicky <u>doesn't</u> usually <u>walk</u> . after the auxiliary (don't/doesn't)
	Vicky <u>isn't</u> often late for work. after the verb to be (negative)
