Do You Speak Camera?

SIMPLE TO UNDERSTAND DEFINITIONS OF COMMON PHOTOGRAPHY TERMS

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EXPOSURE TRIANGLE

The three components that make up the exposure of an image on the camera's sensor. It consists of aperture, shutter speed and ISO.

APERTURE

A small hole or opening in the camera's lens that allows light in, or blocks light, from hitting the camera's sensor.

SHUTTER SPEED

How fast (or slow) the camera's shutter opens and closes when capturing an image.

ISO

A measure of the camera's sensitivity to light. The lower the number, the less sensitive, and vise versa.

AUTOMATIC MODE

You let the camera do all the decision making. A set it and forget it approach to capturing pictures.

SEMI-AUTOMATIC MODE

You control one aspect of the exposure triangle (the shutter speed or the aperture), the camera decides the rest.

APERTURE PRIORITY

A semi-automatic camera mode where the photographer controls the aperture, and the camera fills in the blanks with ISO and Shutter Speed.

MANUAL MODE

A camera mode where the photographer is in full control of the three aspects of the exposure triangle - aperture, shutter speed and ISO.

This refers to how your camera grabs focus. Options range FOCUS MODE from completely automatic, to controling by a single point (my preferred method. The person or thing/object you are photographing. The SUBJECT primary focus of the photograph. The time one hour to 90 minutes after sunrise, or 90 minutes GOLDEN HOUR to one hour before sunset when the sun is soft and glowing in the sky. The PERFECT time of day for photos. A certain type of shade that is great for photography. It's any kind of shade you are standing in where you can look up and OPEN SHADE still see the sky. A type of indoor light. This light comes from one direction of DIRECTIONAL LIGHT the image, and sweeps across the frame from left to right or vice versa. A type of light where the primary light source is coming from BACKLIGHT behind your subject. A pre-determined group of settings applied to an image in PRESET order to enhance it's artistic appearance. You let the camera do all the decision making. A set it and AUTOMATIC MODE forget it approach to capturing pictures. This refers to how you frame your subject in an image, or COMPOSITION where you put them in the frame when snapping a photo. A set of principles that act as a guideline for compelling composition by dividing the frame into nine equal RULE OF THIRDS compartments and framing based on the intersection of those points.
