## **Discussion Guide**

1. According to a <u>2017 NPR/ProPublica investigation</u>, maternal mortality is dropping in every other wealthy country (and many less affluent ones). Yet, in the US maternal deaths rose from 2000 to 2014. The research shows stark racial disparities when it comes to maternal mortality: African American women are more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes than women in any other ethnic or racial group.

How could obstetric violence be tied to racial discrimination during pregnancy, birth and postpartum?

2. According to research by Dr. Kathleen Kendall-Tackett, 27% of moms, over 1 out of 4, suffers post-trauma symptoms after birth.

How is birth trauma recognized? What can be done to lower the number of mothers experiencing birth trauma?
