Cooperative development means different things to different people.



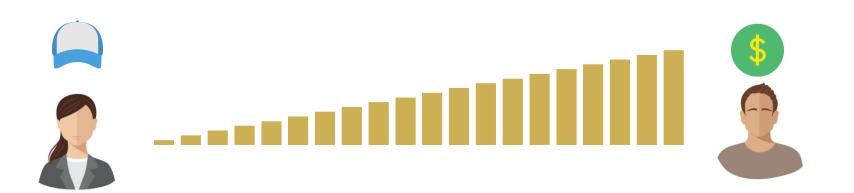




One way to see the range is by asking whether work is **high or low touch**.

I'm investing time.

I'm investing money.



Low touch

High touch



Low touch work has broader impacts. It can reach more people, faster, less expensively.

It tends to help people who already have resources.

High touch work has deeper impacts. It may be slower, more expensive, and impact fewer people.

It can help people gain access to resources.











Every development activity falls somewhere in this **high to low** range Many are somewhere in the middle.

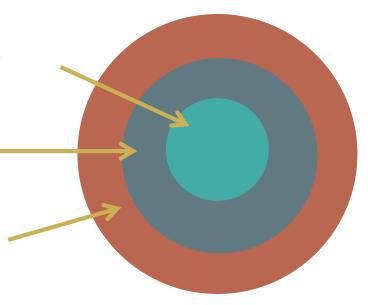

Outside the business





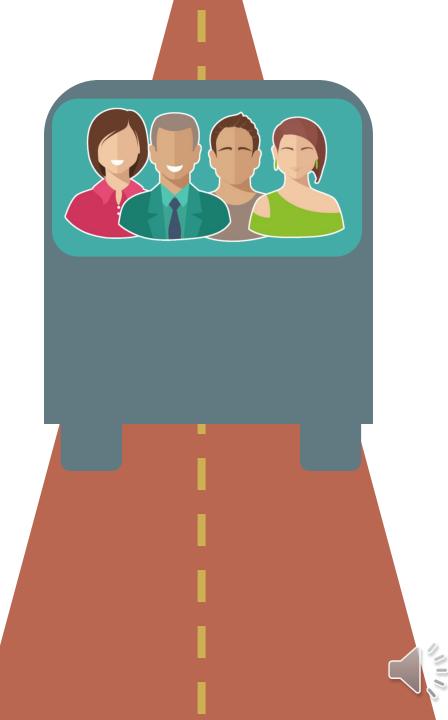


You can think of it like a road trip.

Business DevelopmentTune up your vehicle.

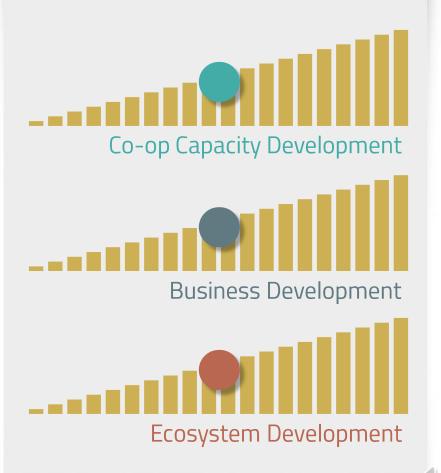
Ecosystem DevelopmentMake the road.



These areas all have **high and low** touch approaches.



Worker Cooperative Development



Low touch may encourage people to be democratic.

High touch might may recruit and organize the people.





Low touch may teach people how to borrow or staff.

High touch might invest or play a temporary management role.





Low touch may create awareness or certifications.

High touch might lobby for contracts and form associations.

What are some development models?

Often people think of structures, but don't lose sight of your desired impacts.



Models will dictate the staff skills are needed.



Developers should ask themselves....



What impacts do I want to have? For whom?



Does my staff need to be generalists or specialists?



Is my primary responsibility to certain people, or to the cooperative?







A **low touch developer** assists many people with a variety of different needs.



General awareness is raised.

A low % of cooperatives may launch.







An **academy** gives more extended attention and creates a peer network.



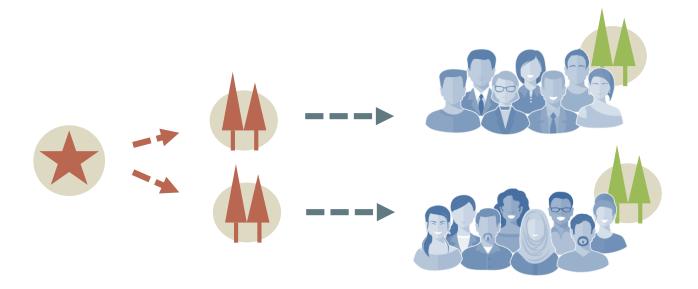
The likelihood of success is increased thorough a focus on skills training.







An **incubator** takes a higher touch role in managing the startup cooperative.



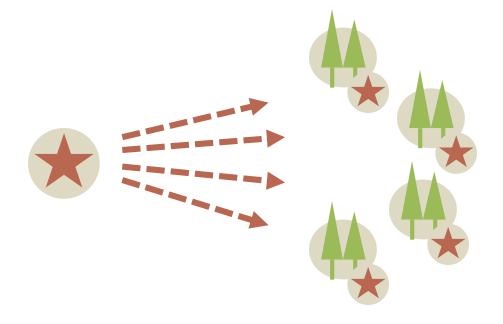
Incubators take on responsibility and risk for the startup businesses' success.







Some developers offer ongoing back-end services to their clients.

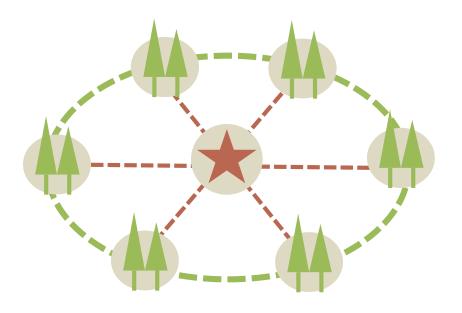


This can fill skills gaps and help operations in the short or long term.





A **franchise** model focuses on replicating success in a single business sector.
