Lesson 2 Summary and Tips

- Any organization of any size and any type can make a difference through procurement.
- Look for ways to apply what you learn in other contexts home, office, school, house of worship, community center wherever you have even a little bit of influence.
- Take a moment to jot down the different industries your supplies come from.
- Some areas of procurement can be emotionally charged. Suspend judgment of those who
 you think are destroying the earth or humanity or animals with their choices. Sustainability
 and procurement are nuanced and the right or wrong is not always as clear as you might
 think.
- Have an open mind and be willing to change both your attitude and behavior.
- Be prepared to pull together a team to help you with sustainable procurement. A task force has the following benefits:
 - o Diverse perspectives bring a wider range of insights.
 - o It's easier to divide and conquer the research.
 - If you have different departments represented, you can learn about opinions and requirements for purchases that could be missed if only one department or person is performing the audit.
 - The findings will spark awareness and knowledge that can be more easily dispersed throughout the organization via team members who are involved.
