



## Perfectly Personal Word Art

### Circle Template 05 – Part 1A Homework – Transcript

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It's time for some homework. Similar to the paper strip section of this class, we're going to approach the homework in three parts. Part one is what we're starting now. As before, I'm going to show you a visual of the template you should create. From that visual, I will offer you tips and pointers on how to complete the steps necessary to make the template. But don't worry, as before, I will provide the step by step instructions in the manual. So if you need extra help, you can always peek at those for the answer.

So here's the visual of the first template of our homework. I'm starting us off with something very simple. I want you to take notice of the three main things we'll have to create. There's the main circle, the inner circle and the type. So step one is to create a new document. The new document specifications are to set up a new document that is 2.25 inches by 2.25 inches at 300 pixels per inch with a transparent background.

Step two is to create the main circle. Here are your main circle hints. The size of the main circle is two inches by two inches. The tool you will want to use is the elliptical marquee tool. And the keyboard shortcut you'll want to use to fill the selection with the foreground color is alt backspace in windows or option delete on a Mac. You also want to make sure you center the circle on the document.

Step three is to create the inner circle. Your inner circle hints are that the size should be 1.8 inches by 1.8 inches. You'll use the same tool as before, the elliptical marquee tool, which means you'll need a new layer and you'll use the same shortcut to fill the selection with the foreground color. Make sure you use a different color for this inner circle and also make sure you center it.

Step four is to add the type. Set your font to something basic and use a size of 24 points. Set the alignment to center and make sure once you're done with the type, you center it on the document both horizontally and vertically.

Now you can save the template as circle template zero four dot PSD in the same location as all of your other circle templates. Here is a visual of the template. Again, this is how your template should look. Once you've completed all of the steps, remember, you can look at the manual in the downloads for this

lesson and get the step by step instructions if you need them. Next up, we're going to do one more circle template together in this fashion. I'll see you there. This is Jenifer Juris with perfectly personal word art.
