To Remember & Recall:

Days of the week (View week 4)

Opposites and using “es”

Es It is / Is

¡Es grande! It's big

¡Es pequeño! It's small.

El niño es alto. The boy is tall

El niño es bajo. The boy is short.

El chico es alto. The kid is tall.

El chico es bajo. The kid is short.

New vocab word: La niña – The girl

New greeting vocab- Asking how someone is doing:

¿Como estas? Estoy (muy) bien, gracias. ¿Y tu?

How are you? I am (very) good, thank you. And yourself?

Using Colors as Adjectives in Spanish

Colors have two forms. The form that ends in O is used for our -el words (masculine words). There is also a form for colors that describes la words that ends in A. This form is used for our -la words (feminine words).

See the examples below:

El libro es amarillo. *El teléfono es rojo.* *El libro es morado.*

La puerta es amarilla. *La pelota es roja.* *La lámpara es morada.*

The following colors are colors that are always the same no matter what the noun is:

Verde, azul, gris, café/marrón, celeste.... See below:

El libro es verde.

El teléfono es gris

La puerta es verde.

La pelota es gris.
