WHAT GIVES POWER TO AN IDEA

- Alan Turing In WW2 he played a pivotal role in cracking intercepted coded messages that enabled the Allies to defeat the Nazis estimated saved more than 14m lives and shortened the war by two years
- Mahatma Ghandi 'an eye for an eye makes the whole world blind'. Believed in concept of ahimsa and non-violence. Timing was perfect as it enabled independence from UK
- Alexander the Great "An army of sheep led by a lion is better than an army of lions led by a sheep" A leader with good ideas is better than a strong army
- Arab Spring Colonel Gaddafi and other leaders were defeated due to the power of social media
