#### CGC + 5 TRICKS

If your dog has earned its Canine
Good Citizen title, you only need to
demonstrate **5** tricks to earn your
novice trick dog title

#### LURES MAY BE USED

Clickers, treats, food lures and toy lures are allowed during testing at the novice level

Demonstrate Tricks Twice
You need to demonstrate each trick
2 times

#### 10 TRICKS

If you do not have a Canine Good Citizen title, you will need to demonstrate 10 tricks to earn your novice trick dog title

## 2 HANDLER'S CHOICE

You are allowed **2** handler's choice tricks.

Balance beam (walk on board a few inches off floor)
Bark on cue ("Speak")
Crawl (dog on belly, crawls at least 3 body lengths)
Fetch it (ball, etc., 10 ft. away, bring to handler within 2 ft)
Find it (find treat or scent item hidden under 1 cup or object)
Get your (Leash, brush, name of toy)
Get in (gets in box)
Sits in box (on cue)
Get on (gets on low platform or step - 4 paws)
Hand signals (Choose one: down, sit, or come)
High five
Hold (3 seconds)
Jump (thru a low hoop or over a low bar)
Kennel up (go in crate, stay in until released)
Kiss (point to cheek or back of hand)
Paws up (2 front paws on low stool or step)
Push-ups (sit, down, sit, down)
Shake hands
Spin in circle
Touch it (hand or target stick)
Tunnel (agility tunnel or child's tunnel)
