Creating a Blended Learning Strategy

Successfully implementing a blended learning program requires analysis and thoughtful planning. To create an effective, comprehensive plan:

- Work to identify your district's three biggest challenges over the next one to two years.
- Outline your goals knowing what you want to achieve with your blended learning program is paramount because, as you experience the ups and downs of introducing a new program, revisiting the strategic goals will help you remain focused and grounded.

- Identify technology tools and online programs that can help you address your challenges or goals.
- Determine your budget and funding resources.
- Create a timeline and set of expectations for your blended learning program implementation.





Creating a Blended Learning Strategy-Alignment

Successfully implementing a blended learning program requires alignment. To create alignment:

Align goals with district priorities

- Determine key stakeholders who must buy into the project (start with top 3)
-] Understand the key resources you will need, and who in your district can provide them

Identify the individual that will make up the core team – list by role and process

Keep on course – stay on the timeline you initially created for the project and communicate successes
