Linking words: Purpose – Exercise

Use the linking word in brackets to formulate the same idea as the original sentence containing 'so'.

If there are several formulation possibilities, choose one. Make sure you use the correct punctuation.

Example:

I'm writing it down, so I don't forget. (in order to)
