Deliverance of Delight

Delight

"To gain great pleasure, satisfaction, or happiness."

Living a life of delight is living a life of constant communion with King Jesus. Constant meaning right in the middle of all the miracles and the messiness of life. It's pursuing communion with Jesus on the good days, the bad days, the easy days, and the hard days. It's when you choose to delight yourself in the Lord as you're celebrating the peaks of the mountain tops or what feels like surviving the depths of the valleys. Meditate in His Temple

To meditate in the temple of God is to focus on and be consumed by the ways of Yahweh. I'm reminded of the story when Moses sees the Lord's glory. The Lord had told Moses to take the people up to the Promised Land. But the Lord had not told Moses who he would send with him. The Lord did tell Moses that he knew Moses by name and that he looked favorably upon him. When Moses heard that the Lord looked favorably upon him, he had a request for the Lord. Moses requested to know the ways of God so that he may understand the Lord more fully and continue to enjoy his favor. In other words, that he may focus on and delight in the perfections of God, the ways of God.

The story goes on... "The Lord replied, "I will personally go with you, Moses, and I will give you rest- everything will be fine for you." Then Moses said, "If you don't personally go with us, don't make us leave this place. How will anyone know that you look favorably on me- on me and on your people- if you don't go with us? For your presence among us sets your people and me apart from all other people on the earth." The Lord replied to Moses, "I will indeed do what you have asked, for I look favorably on you, and I know you by name."

Moses responded, "Then show me your glorious presence." The Lord replied, "I will make all my goodness pass before you, and I will call out my name, Yahweh, before you. For I will show mercy to anyone I choose, and I will show compassion to anyone I choose. But you may not look directly at my face, for no one may see me and live." The Lord continued, "Look, stand near me on this rock. As my glorious presence passes by, I will hide you in the crevice of the rock and cover you with my hand until I have passed by. Then I will remove my hand and let you see me from behind. But my face will not be seen." Exodus 33:14-23 NLT

Encountering the presence of the Lord (the nearness of our God) is a byproduct of meditating in His Temple. As you meditate in the temple of God, you will be vastly aware that the Lord knows you by name, that He looks favorably upon, and that His very presence will be with you as you go where He has called you to go and you do what He has called you to do. Moses wanted to know the ways of God that he may continue to enjoy the favor of God. Moses was a mighty deliverer with the Lord.

It's my prayer that we do not do great thing for God, but rather we do great things with God. When we are aware that God is with us, then we can truly live and serve out of a place of rest. Rest assured, the same promise God gave to Moses is the same promise He is speaking to us today, "Everything will be fine for you." May we be a people that live refreshed and overflowing in the glorious presence of the Lord every day.



Happily Hidden

The microphones eventually lose their battery power. The stage lights eventually turn off. The coffee eventually runs dry. All the people eventually go home. All the noise eventually becomes quiet. Eventually you will find yourself in the hidden place of your soul where it's just you and Creator God. It's in that place that He releases the invitation, "Come away with me." It's in that place that the songs of seclusion find their melody. It's in that place that our thirsty soul meets the saturating water of the Holy Spirit. It's in that place that we die and fully come alive at the same time. It's in that place that our song produces an oil of intimacy that carries a sweet aroma and fragrance unveiling the happy gospel. It's becoming one with our Bridegroom King and receiving His perfect love all while being liberated from the fears of this world. The deliverance of delight includes being happily hidden in God. I'm reminded of John 17 where Jesus was praying to the Father for His disciples.



"I am praying not only for these disciples but also for all who will ever believe in me through their message. I pray that they will all be one, just as you and I are one- as you are in me, Father; and I am I in you. And may they be in us so that the world will believe you sent me. I have given them the glory you gave me, so they may be one as we are one. I am in them and you are in me. May they experience such perfect unity that the world would know that you sent me and that you love them as much as you love me. Father, I want these whom you have given me to be with me where I am. Then they will see all the glory you gave me because you loved me even before the world began!"

John 17: 20-24 NLT
