

## Lesson Three – Stopping on the Journey Luke 18:1-8; Mark 1:29-39; Luke 5:12-16; Matthew 14:13-21

As we continue our *Journey with Jesus*, we continue to see more about how he conducted his life. We see more and more teaching and examples that not only applied in the first century but also apply today. The lesson this week is no exception. However, we notice that a key and frequent component of his journey was that he often took a break to get revived and rejuvenated. In our fast-paced culture, that certainly sounds appealing! Let's get into our study and see how Jesus was in the habit of *Stopping on the Journey*.

- 2. Spend some time perusing the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. What other examples of prayer do you see that Jesus provides in his life? Consider how each one of these fit into his ministry.
- 3. Jesus spent the night in prayer before he chose the twelve apostles. (Luke 6:12). Can you imagine spending an entire night in prayer? What would you pray about if you were to spend the night in prayer? What do you think would be the result?
- 4. Memorize Luke 5:16.

Think about the last time you took a road trip. Maybe it was a business trip or a family vacation. Did you make any stops along the way?
