Digital Scrapbooking Mastery, No. 2 Lesson 11: Corrugated Whimsical Heart for Adobe Photoshop Manual © 2019 Jen White

Corrugated elements are not only trendy, they add loads of depth and texture to a digital scrapbook page. In this lesson we'll take a little treasure hunt through the web and assemble a perfectly practical element of love.

- Begin in Adobe Photoshop.
- Open the document (File > Open) you ended with in Lesson 10.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of all existing groups to hide them.
- Click on the top group to active it.
- Press the letter D to reset the Color Chips to the default of black over white.
- In the Menu Bar, choose View > Show and place a checkmark next to Grid.
- Choose View and place a checkmark next to Rulers.

NOTE: This lesson is not intended to be an introduction or complete explanation of the Pen tool. If you'd like further information or practice with the Pen tool, you'll find that information in my Selections 2 class. You'll find a discount link for that class in the Welcome section of

Create a Heart Path

- Get the Pen tool.
- In the Tool Options, set the Tool Mode to Path and the Path Operations to Combine Shapes. Open Settings and check Rubber Band. Check Auto Add/Delete.
- On the document, click to place an anchor point at the intersection of 9x6.



• Click and drag from the 5x4 to the 3x4.



• Click at the 3x5.



• Click and drag from the 5x6 to the 7x6.



• Hold down the Alt key (Mac: Opt key) and click on the anchor point at the 5x6 intersection.



• Click and drag from the 4x7 to the 4x8.



• Click at 5x8.



• Click and drag from 9x6 to 11x4.



- In the Menu Bar, choose View > Show and uncheck Grid.
- In the Paths panel (Window > Paths), click on the Load Path As a Selection icon.



- In the Layers panel, click on the Create a New Layer icon.
- Double click directly on the name of the new layer and rename it, Heart.
- Press Alt Backspace (Mac: Opt Delete) to fill the selection with black.
- Press Ctrl D (Mac: Cmd D) to deselect.



Find a Corrugated Texture Image

- Go to <u>Pixabay.com</u> and login. Accounts are free and easy to create.
- Search for "corrugated cardboard."
- Choose Corrugated Cardboard by lovepixs.



- Click Free Download.
- Choose 2550x3301 and click Download.

NOTE: You will need to create a free account with Pixabay in order to get the full resolution image.

Add Texture To the Heart Shape

- Open the cardboard image (File > Open) you just downloaded.
- Get the Move tool.
- On the document, hold down the Shift key and drag the corrugated image onto your Mastery 2 scrapbook page.
- In the Layers panel, double click directly on the name of the image layer and rename it, Corrugation.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Create Clipping Mask.
- Press Ctrl T (Mac: Cmd T) to get the Transform options.
- In the Tool Options, set the Width to 150%.
- On the document, click and drag the cardboard around until only the corrugation shows.
- Click the checkmark to commit.



Warp the Edges

- In the Layers panel, hold down the Shift key and click on the Heart layer. Now both layers should be active.
- Press Ctrl J (Mac: Cmd J) to duplicate the two active layers.
- Press Ctrl E (Mac: Cmd E) to merge them.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Filter > Liquify.
- In the dialog box, click on the + icon several times to zoom into the heart. Get the Forward Warp tool. Set the Size to 100.
- On the image, slightly click and drag the right-facing edges of the heart to the right (to pull the pixels out) in all the areas there are hills in the corrugation.
- Slightly click and drag the left-facing edges of the heart to the right (to push the pixels in) in all the areas there are hills in the corrugation.



- Click OK to commit the changes.
- In the Layers panel, click and drag the original Corrugation layer (downloaded image) to the Trash icon.

Add Color to the Corrugation

- In the Layers panel, the Corrugation layer should be active.
- Click on the Add New Fill or Adjustment Layer icon and choose Hue/Saturation.
- In the Properties panel, click on the Clipping Mask icon and move the Saturation slider all the way to the left to desaturate the corrugation.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Add New Fill or Adjustment Layer icon and choose Solid Color.
- In the Swatches panel, click on medium colored swatch, or choose a medium color from the Color Picker. I'm using Hex #be5d91. Click OK.

NOTE: Very light or very dark colors will not blend well with this technique.

- In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Create Clipping Mask.
- In the Layers panel, set the Blend Mode to Color.



Add Color to the Heart Backing

- In the Layers panel, holding down the Alt key (Mac: Opt key) click and drag a duplicate Color Fill layer above the Heart layer.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Create Clipping Mask.
- In the Layers panel, set the Blend mode of the duplicate Color Fill layer to Normal.
- Double click on the thumbnail of the duplicate Color Fill layer to open the Color Picker.
- On the document, click to sample a dark shade of the current color.
- In the Color Picker, click OK.



Create a Group

- In the Layers panel, click on the top Color Fill layer to activate it.
- Holding down the Shift key, click on the Heart layer. Now all layers associated with the heart element should be active.
- Click on the Create a New Group icon.
- Double click directly on the name of the new group and rename it, Corrugated Whimsical Heart.

Add a Drop Shadow

- In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Layer Style > Drop Shadow.
- In the dialog box, set the Blend Mode to Multiply, the Opacity to 50%, the Angle to 120, the Distance to 5, the Spread to 20, and the Size to 25. Click OK.

Add the Heart To Your Mastery2 Scrapbook Page

- In the Layers panel, click on the Visibility icon of the rest of the groups to reveal them.
- The Corrugated Whimsical Heart group should still be active.
- Press Ctrl T (Mac: Cmd T) to get the Transform options.
- In the Tool Options, set the Width to 25% and the Rotate to -10. Click the checkmark to commit.
- Get the Move tool.
- On the document, click and drag the heart to the bottom of the photo grouping.



Save the Document

• Save the document (File > Save).
