Mathilde: **Bonjour! Bienvenue à High Five French!**

Emma: Welcome to High Five French. My name is Emma. **Je m'appelle Emma.**

Mathilde: **Moi, c'est Mathilde.**

Emma: Mathilde is helping me to learn some French.

Mathilde: What do you want to learn today, Emma?

Emma: Well, I'd quite like to learn some greetings, things like "hello", "goodbye", and that kind of thing.

Mathilde: Greetings. **OK, c'est parti!**

Emma: The first word I'd like to learn how to say in

**c'est parti!**

Literally this means "it has left", but it's a very common expression used to get an activity started.

French is "hi".

Mathilde: "Hi" is **salut**.

Emma: **Salut**.

Mathilde: **Salut**. [You try!] Good. You can also say  
**bonjour**.

Emma: **Bonjour**.

Mathilde: **Bonjour**. [You try!] **Bien!**

Emma: I can say "hello", but how do I say  
"goodbye"?

Mathilde: "Goodbye" is **au revoir**.

Emma: **Au revoir**.

Mathilde: **Au revoir**. *C'est difficile*. **Au revoir**. [You  
try!] **Bravo**. *On a trois mots*: **salut**.

Emma: **Salut**.

Mathilde: **Bonjour**.

Emma: **Bonjour**.

for "good afternoon"?
