What does success mean for you? What would a successful life look and feel like?

If you could have anything in the world what would it be?

What do you most want to get out of coaching?

What tips could you give me, so that I can manage our coaching relationship most effectively?

How rigorous do you want me to be as your coach?

How specifically do you release stress?
