# **Subdivision go-ahead**

### Panel recommends land rezoning, concludes carve-up will benefit community

AN independent planning panel has backed a bid to subdivide a 20ha Donvale property owned by the Mathews family. The panel's report released last

The panel's report released last Wednesday recommended Manningham Council adopt planning scheme amendment C83 and rezone the land at 112-126 Warrandyte Rd from low-density residential to residential 1. This would allow the owners to subdivide the land into 56 blocks

instead of 34 and see 45 per cent of the land retained as public open space. Manningham Coun-cil is keen to use the land to com-plete the Mullum Mullum track.

plete the Mullum Mullum track. The report concluded the subdivision would "result in a net community benefit". Planning and environment director Paul Molan said the council would work with the Mathews to address issues raised in the report such as the need for building permits and flooding concerns. Mr Molan

said it was rare for councils to go against state planning panel rec-ommendations. The council is expected to vote on the amend-ment in May. Nearby residents have been critical of the plan, first pro-posed in 2003, with 41 of 76 sub-

missions objecting to the

The council knocked back plans to subdivide the land in 2007 be-cause of concerns it would change the character of the area, a notion rejected by the recent panel.
