Eco-dyed Tangling Materials & Supplies

Eco-dyed papers: real versus fake

The most important and unusual component of this project is, of course, the eco-dyed papers. The process of creating real eco-dyed papers is a bit complex, therefore I recommend that you either purchase the papers ready from a third party supplier, or use the instructions in the lesson to create "fake" eco-dyed papers.

Real Eco-dyed papers:

Fake Eco-dyed papers:

For those who cannot acquire or make eco-dyed papers. I have included a complete description on how to create simulated "fake" eco-dyed papers using distress inks and watercolors. To create these simulated papers, you will need the following supplies:

- Flat real individual leaves
- **Dylusions Ink Spray in Yellow Zest**
- Dark brown ink, distress ink or watercolor
- Hotpressed watercolor paper or Bristol Vellum paper
- Water spray bottle
- Large plastic container
- Smaller plastic container
- Gloves
- Iron
- Paper towels

Tangling Supplies

Additionally, you will also need common supplies to colorize and tangle the project.

- Watercolor set. Use any brand of watercolor to colorize and shade the eco-dyed project.
- Medium and small paintbrushes. I use a number 6 medium watercolor paintbrush and a number 3 small paintbrush.
- Two jars with clean water. I use one jar to clean my brush and another one to dip in water.
- Brown Sakura Micron 01 pen. For tangling over the eco-dyed paper.
- White gel pen. My favorite is Sakura Gelly Roll #10.
- White Charcoal, Pastel or colored pencil. My favorite is Faber Castell Pitt Pastel Medium or Derwent Drawing Chinese White.
- Burnt Umber and Yellow colored pencils. My favorite brand is Faber Castell Polychromos.
