










Trailering Terms & Keywords

Tongue Weight

The downward force of the trailer on the hitch ball on the back of the tow vehicle. Tongue Weight should be 10-15% of



Dry Weight

The total weight of the tow vehicle without passengers, cargo and all fluids needed for operation.





Curb Weight

The total weight of the tow vehicle without passengers and cargo. It does include gas, oil and other fluids.



Payload

The maximum amount of weight that can be added to a vehicle. Payload equals the Gross Vehicle Weight Rating



Follow all manufacturer recommendations for your tow vehicle. Failure to do so may result in vehicle or trailer damage and accidents.

Half-ton trucks have tow capacities as high as 14,000 lb, which is impressive. Take the Ford F-150, the most popular truck on the road. It boasts such a rating on newer models with premium tow packages, but there is a catch. Ford

states that it can tow 14,000 lb. if, and only if, it uses weight distribution. Without weight distribution, the max towing capacity is only 5,000 lb, which leads to an obvious question: Why is that the case? **READ NOW**


