to talk about life experiences

My sister has won too many awards.

I have been to France.

for past events with present results

He has had some bad news.
I have broken my arm.

to talk about unfinished time periods

I have been very busy this week.

He has had three cups of coffee today.

to express the length of actions

I have worked here since 2003.

She has been abroad for three weeks.

for the news and recent events

The Queen has given a speech.

The famous actor has died.

to talk about habitual actions

We have eaten in this restaurant many times.

I have seen this film over a dozen times.

PRESENT PERFECT TENSE

HOW TO FORM?

POSITIVE FORM

I / You / We / They have been. He / She / It has been.

NEGATIVE FORM

I / You / We / They haven't been.

He / She / It hasn't been.

QUESTION FORM

Have I / you / we / they been. Has he / she / it been.

POSITIVE ANSWERS

Yes, I / you / we / they have. Yes, he / she / it has.

NEGATIVE ANSWERS

No, I / you / we / they haven't.

No, he / she / it hasn't.
