## **Homelessness: System Approach Benefits**

- Prevent homelessness by addressing the system that allows it to occur (early intervention)
- Better coordination amongst services
- Increased cooperation and shared knowledge across the community and government
- Increase stability and more community involvement opportunities for the homeless

- Increase expertise and ability of service providers to assist those with complex needs
- Improve cooperation and collaboration among service providers
- Improved client services and access to services
- Reduced cost of services
- Reduce service duplication

## Homelessness

#### 1. Homeless Action Advisory Committee

- 1.1. Overseeing the implementation of the Homlessness Action Plan
- 1.2. Assist in identification and prioritization of homlessness social needs
- 1.3. Supporting, promoting, and undertaking initiatives to address homelessness
- 1.4. Providing a forum to engage stakeholders
- 1.5. Exploring opportunities for funding and other partnerships
- 1.6. Considering any other related matter

#### 2. Coordinated Intake and Referral System

- 2.1. Prevention and diversion from homelessness
- 2.2. Accommodation and support to access housing and services
- 2.3. Emergency response

## Housing

#### Supported Housing in Abbotsford

1.1. Provides a range of on site skills, non-clinical supports, and connections to health care services

#### 2. Housing With Abbotsford Rental Connect (HARC)

- 2.1. Rental housing in the private market through wrap around supports for tenants and property
- 2.2. Tenant management services for owners and managers

#### 3. Affordable Housing Strategy - Plan200K

- 3.1. Determine the current and future housing demands and needs
- 3.2. Aid to the city in decision making and partnerships
- 3.3. Important to keep updated
- 3.4. Support the vision: all Abbotsford residents live in safe, stable, appropriate housing that is affordable, and the policies will support developing market and non-market housing options

- Curriculum and professional development credits in conjunction with the University of the Fraser Valley
