




Digital Scrapbooking Mastery, No. 2 Altering Lesson 7: Hearty Herringbone Pattern Manual © 2019 Jen White

Did you know that sticking with a simple black horizontal herringbone pattern is not your only option? Here are three quick ways to alter the look of the pattern in your toolbox.


Change the Color of the Herringbone Pattern

- Continuing with the 200x200px document you created in Lesson 7 or open the PNG file (File > Open) you saved from Lesson 7.
- Click on the Foreground Color Chip to open the Color picker.
- Sample a color from the document, choose a color in the Color Picker, or choose a swatch from the Color Swatches panel. Click OK.
- Press Shift Alt Backspace (Mac: Shift Opt Delete) to fill the pattern with the foreground color.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Edit > Define Pattern.
- In the dialog box, name the pattern Herringbone-White and click OK.
- Revert to the previous state of the document (Ctrl/Cmd Z) or close the working document without saving.



Create Vertical Herringbone

- Continuing with the 200x200px document you created in Lesson 7 or open the PNG file (File > Open) you saved from Lesson 7.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Image > Rotate > 90° Left. (PS: Choose Image > Image Rotation > 90° Clockwise.)
- In the Menu Bar, choose Edit > Define Pattern.
- In the dialog box, name the pattern Herringbone-Vertical and click OK.
- Revert to the previous state of the document (Ctrl/Cmd Z) or close the working document without saving.



Changing the Color of the Pattern

- Open a document (File > Open) that has the Herringbone pattern applied to a layer.
- In the Layers panel, click on the Pattern Fill layer that contains the Herringbone pattern to activate it.
- In the Menu Bar, choose Layer > Simplify Layer.
- Click on the Foreground Color Chip to open the Color picker.
- Sample a color from the document or choose a color in the Color Picker and then click OK.
- Press Shift Alt Backspace (Mac: Shift Opt Delete) to fill the simplified pattern with the foreground color.
