Job 29-31—Job's final assertion of innocence

Job 29 And Job again took up his discourse, and said: ² "Oh, that I were as in the months of old, as in the days when God watched over me; ³ when his lamp shone upon my head, and by his light I walked through darkness; ⁴ as I was in my autumn days, when the friendship of God was upon my tent; ⁵ when the Almighty was yet with me, when my children were about me;

⁶ when my steps were washed with milk, and the rock poured out for me streams of oil! ⁷ When I went out to the gate of the city, when I prepared my seat in the square, ⁸ the young men saw me and withdrew, and the aged rose and stood; ⁹ the princes refrained from talking, and laid their hand on their mouth; ¹⁰ the voice of the nobles was hushed, & their tongue cleaved to the roof of their mouth.

¹¹ When the ear heard, it called me blessed, and when the eye saw, it approved; ¹² because I delivered the <u>poor</u> who cried, and the <u>fatherless</u> who had none to help him. ¹³ The blessing of him who was <u>about to</u> <u>perish</u> came upon me, and I caused the <u>widow's</u> heart to sing for joy. ¹⁴ I put on **righteousness**, and it clothed me; my **justice** was like a robe and a turban. ¹⁵ I was eyes to the <u>blind</u>, and feet to the <u>lame</u>. ¹⁶ I was a father to the <u>poor</u>, and I searched out the <u>cause of him whom I did not know</u>. ¹⁷ I broke the **fangs** of the unrighteous, and made him drop his prey from his teeth.

¹⁸ Then I thought, `I shall die in my nest, and I shall multiply my days as the sand, ¹⁹ my roots spread out to the waters, with the dew all night on my branches, ²⁰ my glory fresh with me, and my bow ever new in my hand.' ²¹ Men listened to me, and waited, and kept silence for my counsel. ²² After I spoke they did not speak again, and my word dropped upon them. ²³ They waited for me as for the rain; and they opened their mouths as for the spring rain. ²⁴ I smiled on them when they had no confidence; and the light of my countenance they did not cast down. ²⁵ I chose their way, and sat as chief, and I dwelt like a king among his troops, like one who comforts mourners."

Job 31 "I have made a covenant with my eyes; how then could I look upon a virgin? ² What would be my portion from God above, and my heritage from the Almighty on high? ³ Does not calamity befall the unrighteous, and disaster the workers of iniquity? ⁴ Does not he see my ways, and number all my steps? ⁵ If I have walked with falsehood, and my foot has hastened to deceit; ⁶ (Let me be weighed in a just balance, and let God know my integrity!) ⁷ if my step has turned aside from the way, and my heart has gone after my eyes, and if any spot has cleaved to my hands; ⁸ then let me sow, and another eat; and let what grows for me be rooted out. ⁹ If my heart has been enticed to a woman, and I have lain in wait at my neighbor's door; ¹⁰ then let my wife grind for another, and let others bow down upon her. ¹¹ For that would be a heinous crime; that would be an iniquity to be punished by the judges; ¹² for that would be a fire which consumes unto Abaddon, and it would burn to the root all my increase.

¹³ If I have rejected the cause of my <u>manservant or my maidservant</u>, when they brought a complaint against me; ¹⁴ what then shall I do when God rises up? When he makes inquiry, what shall I answer him? ¹⁵ Did not he who made me in the womb make him? And did not one fashion us in the womb? ¹⁶ "If I have withheld anything that the <u>poor</u> desired, or have caused the eyes of the <u>widow</u> to fail, ¹⁷ or have eaten my morsel alone, and the <u>fatherless</u> has not eaten of it ¹⁸ (for from his youth I reared him as a father, and from his **mother's womb I guided him)**; ¹⁹ if I have seen any one perish for <u>lack of clothing</u>, or <u>a poor man without</u> covering; ²⁰ if his loins have not blessed me, and if he was not <u>warmed</u> with the fleece of my sheep; ²¹ if I have raised my hand against the <u>fatherless</u>, because I saw help in the gate; ²² then let my shoulder blade fall from my shoulder, and let my arm be broken from its socket. ²³ For I was in terror of calamity from God, and I could not have faced his majesty.

²⁴ If I have made gold my trust, or called fine gold my confidence; ²⁵ if I have rejoiced because my wealth was great, or because my hand had gotten much; ²⁶ if I have looked at the sun when it shone, or the moon moving in splendor, ²⁷ and my heart has been secretly enticed, and my mouth has kissed my hand; ²⁸ this also would be an iniquity to be punished by the judges, for I should have been false to God above. ²⁹ If I have rejoiced at the ruin of him that hated me, or exulted when evil overtook him ³⁰ (I have not let my mouth sin by asking for his life with a curse);

³¹ if the men of my tent have not said, `Who is there that has not been filled with his meat?' ³² (the <u>sojourner</u> has not lodged in the street; I have opened my doors to the <u>wayfarer</u>);

³³ if I have concealed my transgressions from men, by hiding my iniquity in my bosom, ³⁴ because I stood in great fear of the multitude, and the contempt of families terrified me, so that I kept silence, and did not go out of doors -- ³⁵ Oh, that I had one to hear me! (Here is my signature! let the Almighty answer me!) Oh, that I had the indictment written by my adversary! ³⁶Surely I would carry it on my shoulder; I would bind it on me as a crown; ³⁷ I would give him an account of all my steps; like a prince I would approach him. ³⁸ "If

my land has cried out against me, and its furrows have wept together; ³⁹ if I have eaten its yield without payment, and caused the death of its owners; ⁴⁰ let thorns grow instead of wheat, and foul weeds instead of barley." The words of Job are ended.

Proverbs 31:10-31 ¹⁰ A good wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels. ¹¹ The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain. ¹² She does him good, and not harm, all the days of her life. ¹³ She seeks wool and flax, and works with willing hands. ¹⁴ She is like the ships of the merchant, she brings her food from afar. ¹⁵ She rises while it is yet night and provides food for her household and tasks for her maidens. ¹⁶ She considers a field and buys it; with the fruit of her hands she plants a vineyard. ¹⁷ She girds her loins with strength and makes her arms strong. ¹⁸ She perceives that her merchandise is profitable. Her lamp does not go out at night. ¹⁹ She puts her hands to the distaff, and her hands hold the spindle. ²⁰ She opens her hand to the poor, and reaches out her hands to the needy. ²¹ She is not afraid of snow for her household, for all her household are clothed in scarlet. ²² She makes herself coverings; her clothing is fine linen and purple. ²³ Her husband is known in the gates, when he sits among the elders of the land. ²⁴ She makes linen garments and sells them; she delivers girdles to the merchant. ²⁵ Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come. ²⁶ She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. ²⁷ She looks well to the ways of her household, and does not eat the bread of idleness. ²⁸ Her children rise up and call her blessed; her husband also, and he praises her: ²⁹ "Many women have done excellently, but you surpass them all." ³⁰ Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain, but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised. ³¹ Give her of the fruit of her hands, and let her works praise her in the gates.

'God has taken his place in the divine council;	
in the midst of the gods he holds judgment:	
² "How long will you judge unjustly	
and show partiality to the wicked?	Selah
³ Give justice to the weak and the orphan;	
maintain the right of the lowly and the destitute.	
⁴ Rescue the weak and the needy;	
deliver them from the hand of the wicked."	
⁵ They have neither knowledge nor understanding,	
they walk around in darkness;	
all the foundations of the earth are shaken.	
⁶ I say, "You are gods,	
children of the Most High, all of you;	

⁷ nevertheless, you shall die like mortals, and fall like any prince."
⁸ Rise up, O God, judge the earth; for all the nations belong to you!

Solutions to Injustice

- 1. Listen to the vulnerable
- 2. Don't do for people what they can do for themselves
- 3. Help people in such a way that when things are better, they will think they did it themselves
- 4. Maintain proximity
- 5. Goal of justice & righteousness: the goal is not to take from the rich & give to the poor, but to make sure everybody has enough.
- 6. Practice a holistic gospel
