

Use the following questions and prompts to help you look at, study, and write about (or narrate about) the artwork you are studying.

- 1. Who and/or what do you see in the painting?
- 2. Describe what is happening. Who? What? When? Where? Why?
- 2. What do you like about this artwork? What do you not like?
- 3. What is the artist emphasizing?
- 4. What do you see in the background?
- 5. Why do you think the artist included that in the background?
- 6. Describe the colors.
- 7. Describe the texture.
- 8. Describe the style.
- 9. Describe how the artwork makes you feel. Does the art make you feel excited, bored, good, bad, scared, weird, etc.? Why?
- 10. Do your eyes move through the artwork in a particular way? What did the artist do to make this happen?
- 11. What adjectives or verbs would you use to describe the art?
- 12. What symmetry or parallelism do you see? What asymmetry do you see?
- 13. If you were to recreate this art, what would you do differently?
- 14. Can you tell something about the artist by looking at this artwork? What is it?
- 15. If you could ask the artist a question, what would it be?
- 16. What story is being told through the artwork?
- 17. Would you like to be in this story? Why or why not?
- 18. What artwork could come next if this were a series?
