- A bonus extra tip to help soup up your chords (at the very end of the video lesson).

HOW TO

Here is a breakdown of how to use this course:

1. **Watch** through the video until you come to the first riff. Pause the video and practise this riff on your piano.

2. Once you feel comfortable, **continue** the video until the next extension of that same riff (usually there are several options of playing the same riff pattern) and pause to practise.

3. Continue through **each of the 5 riffs** of the style, then when you see that a NEW style is being explained pause the video and head to the **backing tracks**.

4. Start with the **slow tempo track** of the style and practise the riffs you've learned.

5. Try the **fast tempo track** with the same riffs, then mix up some of the riff patterns together.

6. **Continue this process** with the remaining styles.



1. Jazz slow tempo - key of G major - using chords I, IV, V.

2. Jazz fast tempo - key of G major - using chords I, IV, V.

3. Pop ballad slow tempo - key of G major - using chords I, IV, ii, V.

4. Pop blues fast tempo - key of F major - using chords V, IV, I.


5. Classical new age slow - key of G major - using chords I, IV, V.

6. Classical new age slow - key of E minor - descending bassline with E minor chord.

If you prefer notation to check you are playing the patterns correctly, they are in the remaining pages.



Jazz Riff Pattern 1 - Stride bass





Jazz Riff Pattern 2 - Stride treble





Jazz Riff Pattern 3 - Ripple chords





Jazz Riff Pattern 4 - Crushed notes.






Jazz Riff Pattern 5 - Chromatic chords.





Pop Riff Pattern 2 - Arpeggios. Idea 2





















Pop Riff Pattern 4 - Driving bass preceding chord.






Pop Riff Pattern 5 - Chord alternating melody.




Classical Riff Pattern 1 - Bass arpeggios with top note stepwise movement











Classical Riff Pattern 3 - Bass 5 - 1 - 3 - 1 with voiceleading. C
