Highly needed

TO STYLE

IV STILL	
WHITE HARD SURFACE	I have an Ikea white table top like <u>this one.</u> 4 years later and I still put it over my chest of drawers. I love this set up!
WHITE FOAMBOARD X 2	These are cheap and you can find them at your local DIY hardware store or an art and crafts store. A1 is a good size and will allow a better light reflection.
A WINDOW	Check the North, South, East and West expositions of your house. I personally prefer the window that faces East.
TO SHOOT	
DSLR CAMERA	Second-hand is much better. Or borrow one from a friend if possible if you never used a DSLR before. More on this before the course starts
TRIPOD	I started with a very simple tripod. No need for something too fancy yet :) Second-hand is also great.
SD CARD	I use a <u>32GB size card</u> , and I have a second one just in case.
TO RETOUCH	
ADOBE PHOTOSHOP	<u>The latest version</u> if possible. It costs around \$10 per month. And a good working computer.
