


# ORGANIZATION

When the team is positioned in a organized way in possession of the ball or out of it



# OFFENSIVE ORGANIZATION



It's the foundation upon which goal-scoring opportunities are built. It's when our team has possession of the ball.

### **Main Principles**

- 1. Create Attacking Team Shape
- 2. Provide Options To Play Forward
- 3. Break Lines To Advance Attack
- 4. Finish The Attack

### **Sub Principles**

- ( ) Create appropriate height, width, depth
- ( ) Move or lose opponent when marked
- ( ) Drive with the ball to exploit space
- ( ) Find a free player between or behind the lines
- ( ) Switch play: change the point of attack
- ( ) Find the player in a position to score or assist
- ( ) Fill in zones in front of goal
- ( ) Finish from the dribble, pass, or cross

# OFFENSIVE ORGANIZATION



It's the foundation upon which goal-scoring opportunities are built. It's when our team has possession of the ball.

- When? The team is in possession;
- Who? The player with the ball and teammates;
- How? Passing and moving into open space;
- What? Organization and pattern of movements and ideas;
- Why? If we have the ball, we can score and the opponent can't.

# DEFENSIVE ORGANIZATION



It's the foundation upon the solidity of the team is built. It's when our opponent has possession of the ball and we look to deny their chances.

### **Main Principles**

- 1. Create Defending Shape
- 2. Build Pressure on the Ball
- 3. Recover When Pressure is Broken
- 4. Deny the Finish

# Sub Principles ( ) Make team compact ( ) Initiate pressure on the opponent with the ball ( ) Engage to regain the ball ( ) Provide cover ( ) Immediately (re-)apply pressure on the ball ( ) Look to intercept passes ( ) Get narrow and close the middle ( ) Challenge to protect against goal attempt

# DEFENSIVE ORGANIZATION



It's the foundation upon which goal-scoring opportunities are built. It's when our team has possession of the ball.

- When? The team is NOT in possession;
- Who? All the players have to defend;
- How? Closing the spaces and being compact;
- What? Organization and pattern of movements and ideas;
- Why? If we don't have the ball, we need to try and get it back.
