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UNDERSTANDING THE DESIGN PROCESS:

How to work with a Client and execute an interior design project.

INTRODUCTION

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WHAT IS "THE DESIGN PROCESS"?

Every project, regardless of size or budget should follow a structure or sequence of events, where one stage flows to the next in a logical way. As designers, we call this The Design Process. The process is generally the same on every project.

Each lecture within this course explains each stage of The Design Process. This is relevant for interior design projects such as the refurbishment of a kitchen, bathroom or entire house, a cafe, a retail store or an office.



The Design Process allows us to spread out our work into smaller steps. If we follow a sequence, we can give our Clients a clear idea of "what happens and when", but also allow us to work methodically towards the finished and built interior.

The designer, the client & the builder need to work together for a successful project. There's no place for ego.

MODULE 1: Client Briefing	How to prepare for the first Client meeting. What to take with you, what questions to ask and what follow up documents to email to the Client afterwards.
MODULE 2: Concept Design	Review different examples of drawings, sketches and mood boards and some easy ways to generate ideas from the project brief.
MODULE 3: Client Presentation	How to structure your presentation meeting for success. Methods to gather Client feedback & answers to Frequently Asked Questions. EG: my Client doesn't like my ideas, what should I do?!
MODULE 4: Design Development	How to source real finishes, furniture & lighting options. What to include on Design Development drawings and the basics of joinery details. What is sent to the Client for review during this stage.
MODULE 5: Documentation - Part 1	Authority Approvals: what this means, how to prepare and what is involved.
MODULE 6: Documentation - Part 2	Construction Drawings and Schedules for finishes, fittings and equipment. Understanding what it means to Tender a project and how to do it.
MODULE 7: Specifying Furniture	The basics of specifying furniture, organising quotes, orders and delivery.
MODULE 8: Construction Administration	What is the Designer's role once the project begins on site. How to liaise with a Builder and the basics of what happens on site.
MODULE 9: Defects & Final Handover	How to prepare a Defect List following a final inspection. What is "final handover" and how to arrange professional photography of your project.

WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This course is the perfect all rounder and something you can always refer back to.

WILL THIS SUBSTITUTE FORMAL DESIGN EDUCATION?

No. We're not trying to overshadow formal design education from College or University. We're not here to teach you HOW to design but rather give you the tools when working with a Client "in the real world". By this stage, you should already have an eye for detail and knowledge about the fundamentals of interior design.

WHAT ABOUT SETTING UP A BUSINESS; DO I LEARN THAT IN THIS COURSE? No. We offer a separate course called BUSINESS BASICS which is another guide that outlines the key steps into launching a freelance or solo business. This course, UNDERSTANDING THE DESIGN PROCESS is specifically for project work and dealing with a Client.

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
