LESSON STRUCTURE

Griggs, Teaching Today's Teachers to Teach

- I. Invite
 - a. Light-hearted opening question
 - b. Review (if appropriate)
- II. Inform
 - a. Read the text
 - b. Give information about the text
- III. Investigate
 - a. Pick 1-3 themes to explore. Refer to other scriptures when appropriate.
 - b. Ask interpretation questions.
- IV. Illustrate
 - a. Discuss the meaning of the text for us.
 - b. Ask application questions.
- V. Inspire
 - a. End on a high note. Read a psalm, sing a song, give a charge.
 - b. End on purpose!

- 2. Write a handful of learning goals/objectives.
 - a. Covered in "Aiming Well"
- 3. Write notes on content
- 4. Sketch outline
 - a. Covered in this session
- 5. Plan learning activities
 - a. Covered in "Tough Crowd"
- 6. Plan questions
 - a. Covered in "The Marks of Good Questions"
- 7. Write as if for someone else.
 - a. Helps you clarify
 - b. Helps if you can't be there.
