




GRAVATAR

Creating a Profile Picture is an important part of establishing relationships online.

When you login to the LEARN platform for the first time you are asked to edit your profile and add a photo. As you engage in the interactive discussion activities these photos support each of you to bring yourself into the conversation starting with your personal, local and immediate racialised experiences.

But first, we need to create the photo using Gravatar.com.

FLIPGRID

Interactive practice and coaching are key features of the online practitioner program.

To record live responses as you practice pieces of the Protocol for Courageous Conversations About Race we use FLIPGRID.

Download the free Flipgrid app to your preferred device – or access online.



The purpose of course video responses is to reflect on and practice Protocol through dialogue.

The opportunity to process your own lived racial experiences helps you to begin to recognise predictable patterns that surface when having courageous conversations about race. Identifying and understanding these patterns helps you to use the tools to engage, sustain and deepen these conversations.

Tips and Troubleshooting

To record

Use your student ID. This is your first name and last initial (lowercase).

Feedback

You will receive emailed feedback for each recording. Flipgrid prefers shorter email addresses. Please keep this in mind when you set up your profile.
