Classroom Rules/ Conduct

These rules are strictly enforced during our group sessions. Failure to adhere may result in removal from the session.

- 1. **Be on time**: Start and join the meeting promptly to respect everyone's time. We cannot backtrack to cover missed content due to lateness. Each class provides 2-3 sessions for your convenience.
- 2. **Mute when not speaking**: Avoid background noise by muting yourself when you're not talking.
- 3. **Use video when possible**: Enable your camera to enhance engagement and foster a more personal connection.
- 4. **Respect others' speaking time**: Allow everyone a chance to speak without interruptions. Use the "raise hand" feature if necessary.
- 5. **Stick to the agenda**: Stay focused on the meeting's purpose and avoid unrelated discussions.
- 6. **Be mindful of your surroundings**: Choose a quiet, private location to minimize distractions.
- 7. **Use chat respectfully**: Utilize the chat function for relevant comments or questions that don't need immediate verbal input.
- 8. **Avoid multitasking**: Stay engaged in the meeting and refrain from doing other tasks simultaneously.
- 9. **Follow host instructions**: Respect the host's guidance regarding meeting protocols and procedures.
