WHO IS THIS FOR?

This video training is for yoga teachers who want to start teaching yoga through video, pre-recorded or live-streaming.

In this video, I'm sharing key take-aways and tips to teaching yoga classes on video.

CLARIFY YOUR PURPOSE

Why are you teaching yoga? Get specific.

Come back to your mission statement.

What is the purpose of this class?

Have a consistent introduction.

CLASS PLAN

Create a class plan or outline.

Have your plan in front of you.

Easier to stick to it on video than in person.

Practice your class before filming.

CREATE YOUR SPACE

Use as much natural light as you can.

Front lit, not backlit (avoid windows behind you).

Box light kits or flood lights work well.

Have a few feet between you and your background.

Yoga mat is usually horizontal.

Your entire body is visible and centered.



CONSIDER YOUR CLOTHES

When you look good (on your terms), you feel good!

Avoid baggy clothing.

Avoid the color black on camera.

Avoid distracting accessories.

CONNECT WITH STUDENTS

Eye contact for video.

Look at the camera often.

Talk to ONE person.

Smile.

CONSISTENT CONTENT

Creating videos regularly builds trust.

Batch film - more than I at a time.

Upload videos on a regular schedule.

Use social media to tease and promote.

KEY WORDS

Title & theme your videos appropriately.

Type of yoga + audience, or solution to a problem.

Search for popular titles and key words.

What is your audience searching for?

CAMERA OPTIONS

iPhone or mobile device

DLSR or similar

Logitech Webcam

Laptop is fine for getting started

Don't forget about a tripod.

CUEING: AUDIO OPTIONS

*For yoga classes, this is often the most important

Blue Yeti Mic

Rode WirelessGo

Lavalier Microphone

Voice over

CALL TO ACTION

What is your viewer's next step?

Lead them to your website, to download a free guide, membership, the next video, etc.

If posting on YouTube, tell people to subscribe and like.

COLOR SCHEME (BRANDING)

Have a consistent look in for each video, both in set up and thumbnails

Take a screenshot then use an app like Wordswag for text over photo

KEEP IT SIMPLE

Teach what you know.

Start with what you have.

Learn and upgrade as you go.
