#### How to Build the Ionian Mode

Here's a quick list of how to build and think about the Ionian mode scale on guitar.

- Intervals R-2-3-4-5-6-7
- 1<sup>st</sup> mode of the major scale.
- A Ionian = A B C# D E F# G#
- Characteristic note = 4<sup>th</sup>

#### How to Learn the Ionian Mode

As you learn the shapes below, here are practice tips you can use to internalize, memorize, and be able to improvise with every scale shape.

- Learn 1 shape at a time, play from memory.
- Play in different keys.
- Play with a metronome in different tempos.
- Use different rhythms and accents.
- Sing along, say the intervals, and/or say the notes as you play.
- Start on any note in the scale, play up, down, and back to that note.
- Solo with the scale over a backing track or with a metronome.


#### How to Solo with the Ionian Mode


Here are chords, keys, and progressions where the Ionian makes for a great soloing choice.


- Over major key chord progressions.







