THE EPISTLE. 1 COR. xv. 1.

BRETHREN, I declare unto you the Gospel  
which I preached unto you, which also ye  
have received, and wherein ye stand: by which  
also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what  
I preached unto you, unless ye have believed in  
vain. For I delivered unto you first of all, that  
which I also received, how that Christ died for  
our sins, according to the Scriptures; and that  
he was buried, and that he rose again the third  
day, according to the Scriptures; and that he  
was seen of Cephas; then of the twelve: after  
that, he was seen of above five hundred bre  
thren at once; of whom the greater part remain  
unto this present, but some are fallen asleep:  
after that, he was seen of James; then of all the  
Apostles: and last of all, he was seen of me also,  
as of one born out of due time. For I am the  
least of the Apostles, that am not meet to be  
called an Apostle, because I persecuted the  
Church of God. But by the grace of God I am  
what I am: and his grace which was bestowed  
upon me was not in vain; but I laboured more  
abundantly than they all; yet not I, but the  
grace of God which was with me. Therefore  
whether it were I or they, so we preach, and  
so ye believed.
