



Lesson 27 - D Major on the 4th String

- [Instructor] Hello and welcome to Lesson 27 on the D major scale on the fourth string. So D is our string here of course and D is the second sharp key which means that along with F sharp that we have here, because F natural was here, remember E and F, right? We have an F sharp that carries through from G major. We also have a C sharp note which is right here. Remember C is here because B and C, A, B, and C, C sharp. So remember these two. We have an F sharp and we have a C sharp. You will also notice something interesting. The D major scale on the fourth string now, Has the same patterns of notes or fret locations as the G major scale on the third string. So we're playing in the same fret basically from the previous video, but now we're simply playing different key. Let's just strum a cord. Good old D cowboy and get used to the sound of the scale on the senior string. So play with me, B, F sharp, G, A, B, C sharp, and D. Let's strum the D cord again. And let's go down the scale, B, C sharp, D, A, G, F sharp, E, D. Now let's use the call and answer using the same process in D major on your fourth string. Same idea as the rest, well everything we've been doing in this course so far. Let's play, D major. I play a line. And good job.
