

These are the '8 parts of speech' found in English Language. They indicate how the word functions in meaning, as well as grammatically within the sentence.

Adjective

An adjective modifies or describes a noun or pronoun (e.g. small, long, orange, Claire's, beautiful, sour)

Adverb

An adverb modifies or describes a verb, an adjective, or another adverb (how the action occurred e.g. quickly, slowly, loudly, late)

Conjunction

A conjunction joins words, phrases, or clauses (e.g. and, or, yet, because, therefore, moreover, since, until, but)

Interjection

An interjection is a word used to express emotion and is often followed by an exclamation mark (e.g. wow! Oh my! Bravo!)

Noun

A noun is the name of a person, place, thing, or idea (e.g. rock, dog, Paul, gravity, birthday)

Pronoun

A pronoun is a word used in place of a noun, so they replace the name of a person, place or thing (e.g. he, she, it, we, they, him, her, this, that, I)

Preposition

A preposition is a word placed before a noun or pronoun to form a phrase modifying another word in the sentence (e.g. describes relationships such as on, over, for, beside)

Verb

A verb expresses action (e.g. run, jump or read) or a state of being (e.g. is or was)
