Can you believe this is our last lesson on triangles? I hope you're enjoying the creative process of making your very own custom word art stash. Part three of the homework is where you get to make your very own templates. I think this is my favorite part of the homework because it's fun to look for inspiration and see what you can create out of it.

So here are the three sources of inspiration I have been challenging you to use throughout this class. The custom shape tool, digital scrapbooking kits, and online galleries are great sources of template design inspiration. Let me show you my three sources of inspiration I found and how I used them to create triangle templates of my own.

First up is the custom shape tool. Looking through the various shapes, I came across the list of arrows and I knew I wanted to use those somehow. So I started playing with various arrows and placements. Don't be discouraged if the first shape you try, doesn't turn out how you envisioned. Keep playing with it or try another shape. In the end, my persistence paid off. Here's the triangle template I created using arrow number 13. It's very simple but the arrow placement is effective. And here's how I chose to customize my template. I loved how the polka dot pattern fit inside the arrow so nicely.

The next source of inspiration is digital scrapbooking kits. This time I found inspiration in a journal card I found online. I found it at Sweete Shop Designs and the journal card pack is called around the world - we go cards by Amanda Yi and Wendy P designs. I know it seems simple but the basic block at the top of the journal card inspired my next triangle template. Here is the template I created based on the journal card I just showed you. I liked that the type centers over the change from one part to the next. Color blocking is something you see in design from home decor to clothing. It's always a good design choice and here is how I chose to customize my triangle template. I used two bright colors and white type to make my triangle pop.

My last source of inspiration was an online gallery. I found this page by just a girl, and as usual, her pages are amazing. I noticed the star cutouts on her layout and I thought those would be a neat touch to another triangle template. So here's the custom triangle template I created. I placed a cutout star in each corner of the triangle, and here is how I chose to customize this template. I used a small Stripe

pattern for the cutout stars and I used a solid paper in the same color family for the main triangle. I really like how the yellow pops off of the dusty orange.
