LEARN THE RULES AND PRACTICE APPLYING THE "T" TURNING INTO A SOFT "D"



#### The Rule:

If a "T," "TT," or "RT" are surrounded by vowel sounds in a word, the "T" changes to a soft "D" sound.

# How it's made

T = D Writer sounds like rider.

TT = D Better sounds like bedder.

RT = RD Party sounds like pardy.

T's are surrounded by vowel "sounds" — Brighter sounds like brider (the GH is silent so it still counts as a T surrounded by vowel sounds!)

### In these words, the T sounds like a D:

beautiful, British, daughter, fighting, vitamin, later, meeting, native, waiting, whatever, ratings, meter

pretty, little, butter, bitter, matter, settle, tattle

artist, party, starting, courtesy, sporting, thirty, hearty, artificial, smarter,

**Exceptions to the rule** (T sounds like T): rotate, hotel, return, protein, imitate, attitude, fatigue, detail, prioritize, invitation, lunatic, attack, potato

# T's turning to D's can span over two words (change the T to a D)

caught-a cold, bought-another car, get-a job, lot-of information, meet-at seven, out-of trouble, put-it-in, what-a guy, write-about this, wait-a minute, right-on time
