This video was filmed in Photoshop Elements but the instructions are just the same in Adobe Photoshop unless where noted.

When starting a new project it is helpful to create a Mood or Inspiration Board.

The following steps can help get you started and help you from feeling overwhelmed at the beginning a new project:

1- Start a Pinterest account if you don't already have one.

2- Pin inspirational images.

Pinterest can feel a bit overwhelming, but I have found that using the Search feature cuts down on my stress level and makes it a much more enjoyable experience.

Here are some helpful search words:

Color trends

Color palettes

Color mood boards

Mood boards (this is a great one for finding images that include colors and inspirational photos)

Mood board inspiration

Wedding colors

Wedding color inspiration

Home decor color

If you have a favorite color you can search by color

3- Take photos with your camera phone that catch your eye.

4- Once you have accumulated a fair amount of inspiring images, download the Mood Board Template.

5- Gather photos, images, and color that work well together from you inspiration folder and put those into a new folder and give it a name.

******PLEASE NOTE:** If Pinterest just isn't your thing, there are tons of great inspirational images on the internet that you can collect and save to a folder on your computer.

Set up Your Workspace

- In the Tool Options, make sure Auto-Select Layer and Show Bounding Box are checked.
(Photoshop: In the Options Bar, make sure Auto-Select Layer and Show Transform Controls are checked)

Using the Mood Board Template

(This is not an assignment and is optional)

- Open the **PFP_Colors-MoodBoard.psd** (File > Open) included in the Passion4Paper-download folder.
- Open gathered images from you inspiration folder.
- Activate one of your images, click and drag over to your Mood Board document and arrange on the right side under Inspiration.
- Continue the step above to add images to your Mood Board.
- Get the Move tool.
- In the Layers panel, activate Swatch 1 on your Mood Board.
- Double-click on the swatch thumbnail to bring up the Color Picker. The Eye dropper tool will automatically be activated. Click somewhere on your images to pick up a color then click OK.

- Following the previous steps, continue selecting colors from the photo and adding them to your swatches.
- Save your Mood Board as a psd in an easy to find location.
