• Canon 5d Mark 4: The Canon EOS 5D Mark IV is a high-end DSLR camera that is well-suited for a variety of photography applications, including jewellery photography. It has a resolution of 30.4 megapixels and a full-frame sensor, which allows it to capture fine details and textures. This is what I personally use

• Canon EOS 5DS R: This camera has a high resolution of 50.6 megapixels and is capable of capturing fine details and textures. It also has a full-frame sensor, which can be helpful for shooting close-up shots of small objects.

• Nikon D850: This camera has a resolution of 45.7 megapixels and a full-frame sensor. It also has fast autofocus and good low-light performance, making it
