Scrapping with Filters, Stamp & PaintChallenge 3: Busy Photo Challenge (Part 1)

TRANSCRIPT

Use the provided busy photo to create a stamp and paint image, then use the image you created on a card or scrapbook page. Welcome to Challenge 3, the photo challenge. In this challenge, I'm asking you to open the flower photo from the class downloads. Use the same instructions from Section 1 of this class showing you how to apply the Stamp filter, apply the Palette Knife filter, paint in color and then mask away the boundary lines. For your reference, here's my completed stamp and paint busy flower photo. See how close you can come to duplicating the image I have here. This image is included in the manual for this video so you can reference it as you work. Here are a few things about this finished image that make it look more artsy and pretty.

Notice that I only used a small portion of the entire busy photo. I chose to create a long thin strip of flowers, but really any shape whatsoever could be achieved. Also notice the varied boundaries of the stamp lines and make a note of how the stamp lines extend past the intended subject, which in this case is approximately 11 flowers. And finally, notice how I only painted on the purple parts of the photo and left the dark areas unpainted.

When you are finished with the stamp and paint technique, take the challenge a bit farther by placing your stamped and colored image on a 7x5 greeting card using the paper and word art from the class downloads. Once you're finished with your design, move on to Part 2 of this challenge and see step-by-step how I created the look for my photo. This challenge should take you more time than the other challenges. So grab your favorite warm and yummy beverage and dig in. This is Jen White with Stamp & Paint.
